### Twinning Review Mission – first test concluded

*The preparation for the regular implementation of Twinning Review Missions foreseen for Projects under the 2009 Manual started successfully with the first test that took place in Turkey last December, as a follow-up of the project TR 06 IB JH 05 " Support to the Turkish National Police in the Enforcement of Intellectual and Industrial Property Rights". More tests are envisaged in the months to come in order to fine-tune procedures. More information will be provided in a special issue of your Twinning News.*

### 43<sup>rd</sup> RTA Training Session

*The 43<sup>rd</sup> Resident Twinning Advisers' training session will take place in Centre Albert Borschette on 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> February. This is the first training of 2011, to which around 30 RTAs are invited. The next RTA Training session is scheduled for June.*

### Eligible as Mandated Bodies

*An Institution has to fulfil five cumulative criteria in order to be considered as eligible for the Mandated Body status. For two of them (Public Ownership of the institution and the Legal Status) a partial fulfilment can be considered acceptable, but in this situation would lead to the awarding of a restricted Mandated Body status that would prevent the application for commercial tenders up to 2 years after the end of the Twinning Project.*

*The remaining three criteria have to be necessarily satisfied: proven competence in the field of expertise, sufficient and proportionate level of permanent staff and permanent and structural*

*supervision of a Government authority.*

*'Sufficient and proportionate level of permanent staff' means that an institution should be able to carry out more the twinning assignment without renouncing to its normal activities due to a lack of human resources.*

*By 'permanent and structural supervision of a government authority' it should be understood that there are representatives of the Public Administration in the decision making process of the institution.*

*Please, bear in mind that the institution has to be granted the Mandated Body status BEFORE the proposal is submitted.*

### Best practice: Electronic versions

*Except when explicitly requested by the Twinning Manual, the circulation of hardcopies of documents should be replaced by the circulation of electronic versions.*

*Exchanging electronic documents you limit shipping costs, reduce the use of paper and can easily enhance the availability of information.*

### Side letters: date of entry into force

*According to Annex C14 of the Twinning Manual 2009, a Side Letter can enter into force the day the Contracting Authority receives the hardcopy signed by both parties.*
