Of the total cost of the Scheme, Rs. 1369.77 Lakhs (Rupees One Thousand Three Hundred Sixty Nine lakhs Seventy Seven thousand only) being the recurring cost of the scheme will be shared on 60:40 basis by the Government of India and Government of **Tamil Nadu**.

- 2. - xii. Grants-in-aid shall be utilized before the end of the current financial year 2022-23 and unspent balance, if any, will be refunded by **Government of Tamil Nadu** to the **Govt. of India**
- xiii. Government of Tamil Nadu in respect of **(a) Anamalai**, **(b) Kalakad Mundanthurai (c) Mudumalai (d) Sathyamangalam and (e) Srivilliputhur Megamalai Tiger Reserves, Tamil Nadu** will maintain a separate account and will present their annual accounts in the standard format as required under GFR 230(5).
- xiv. Grants-in-aid shall be utilized for (a) Anamalai, (b) Kalakad Mundanthurai (c) Mudumalai (d) Sathyamangalam and (e) Srivilliputhur Megamalai Tiger Reserves, Tamil Nadu strictly as per the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, acting through the National Tiger Conservation Authority, Field Director, (a) Anamalai, (b) Kalakad Mundanthurai (c) Mudumalai (d) Sathyamangalam and (e) Srivilliputhur Megamalai Tiger Reserves, Tamil Nadu.
