

8. POOL PROPORTIONS

The pool proportions for books, journals, newspapers/magazines and other will be based on results of external research in 2016 of government employees' copying and sharing of content. The results included high level information about what the surveyed employees had copied in the last 24 hours. From this information, we estimated the overall proportion of usage from books and journals respectively.

The amount set aside for artist-owned images (1% of the total distribution amount) is based on analysis in the UK.

The amount set aside for writers in published collections is based on usage data from Australian universities (the best available 'proxy'): 2% of the pool for books, and 10% of the pools for periodicals (journals, newspapers, magazines). Writers also receive payments from the books pool.

The amount paid to AMCOS for music is based on an agreement with AMCOS.

9. SELECTION OF DATA FROM DATA SOURCES

Books and journals

The selection of titles for the books and journals pools are based on a 'subject matter profile': identification of the subject matter areas likely to be used in governments, and the relative proportions of each. We conduct a

	statistically random selection process to select titles with the relevant subject matter.

APPORTIONMENT TO RIGHTSHOLDERS FROM EACH POOL	 book and journal titles: equal allocation to each title in the dataset that results from the random selection process newspaper and magazine mastheads: in accordance with the relative proportions of the articles from each masthead in the dataset artist-owned images and writers without royalties: based on the number of books or periodicals in which the creator's works have appeared, with adjustments for: titles that have appeared in usage data (e.g. from schools or universities); titles published more recently; and for newspapers and magazines: extent of availability (e.g. higher for national or major metropolitan newspapers, lower for regional or local newspapers). 		
11. DATA 'CARRIED FORWARD'	We will make allocations to rightsholders that we have a reasonable prospect of paying. 12. MINIMUM ALLOCATION	There will be a \$10 minimum allocation for some pools.		
13. OBLIGATION TO SHARE PAYMENTS	Recipients of allocations from the books pool are required to share payments in accordance with any contractual obligations (e.g. a publishing contract between an author and a publisher).		
14. NUMBER OF RECIPIENTS	There will be about 1,400 <i>direct</i> recipients of payments for books, journals and other publications. Allocations for books are shared with writers and illustrators entitled to royalties. Writers and artists also receive payments from the aggregated writers in published collections distribution and the artist-owned images distribution.
