1.1 Configuring CodeArts Console Permissions

1.1.1 CodeArts Console Permissions

If you need to assign different permissions to employees in your enterprise to access your purchased CodeArts resources, IAM is a good choice for fine-grained permissions management. IAM provides identity authentication, permissions management, and access control, helping you secure access to your resources.

With IAM, you can use your account to create IAM users, and assign permissions to the users to control their access to specific resources. For example, some software developers in your enterprise need to use CodeArts resources but should not be allowed to perform any other high-risk operations, such as buying CodeArts resources. In this scenario, you can create IAM users for the software developers and grant them only the permissions required for viewing CodeArts resources.

If you do not require individual IAM users, skip this chapter.

IAM can be used free of charge. You pay only for the resources in your account. For more information about IAM, see IAM Service Overview.

CodeArts Console Permissions

By default, new IAM users do not have any permissions. You need to add them to one or more groups, and then add permissions policies or roles to these groups. The users inherit permissions from their groups and can then perform specified operations on cloud services.

CodeArts is a project-level service deployed and accessed in specific physical regions. To assign permissions to a user group, specify the scope as region-specific projects and select projects for the permissions to take effect. If **All projects** is selected, the permissions will take effect for the user group in all region-specific projects. When accessing CodeArts, the users need to switch to a region where they have been authorized.

CodeArts uses policies for fine-grained authorization.

 Policies: a type of fine-grained authorization mechanism that defines permissions required to perform operations on specific cloud resources under certain conditions. This mechanism allows for more flexible authorization.
 Policies allow you to meet requirements for more secure access control. For example, you can grant CodeArts users only the permissions for performing specific operations on the CodeArts console.

Table 1-1 lists all system permissions of CodeArts.

1.1.2 Creating and Authorizing a User

You can use **Identity and Access Management** (IAM) to implement fine-grained permissions control for your CodeArts console. With IAM, you can:

 Use your account to create IAM users for employees based on the organizational structure of your enterprise. Each IAM user has their own security credentials for accessing CodeArts resources. • Assign only the permissions required for users to perform a specific task.

If your account does not require individual IAM users, skip this section.


This section describes the procedure for granting permissions (see Figure 1-1).

Prerequisites

Learn about the permissions supported by CodeArts and choose permissions according to your requirements. For the permissions of other services, see **System Permissions**.

Process

Figure 1-1 Process for granting CodeArts console permissions



1. Create a user group and assign permissions.

Create a user group on the IAM console, and attach the **DevCloud Console ReadOnlyAccess** policy to the group.

2. Create an IAM user and add it to a group.

Create a user on the IAM console and add the user to the group created in 1.

3. Log in and verify permissions.

Log in to the console as the created user and switch to the region for which the user is authorized to verify permissions.

Choose **CodeArts** in **Service List**, and then choose **Enterprise Account Authorization** in the navigation pane. Click **Authorize Enterprise Account**, and enter an account ID. If a message is displayed indicating that you cannot access the page, the **DevCloud Console ReadOnlyAccess** policy has already taken effect.

1.1.3 Custom Policies

You can customize policies to supplement system-defined policies of CodeArts.

You can create custom policies using one of the following methods:

- Visual editor: Select cloud services, actions, resources, and request conditions. You do not need to have knowledge of the policy syntax.
- JSON: Create a policy in the JSON format from scratch or based on an existing policy.

For details, see **Creating a Custom Policy**. This section provides examples of common custom policies in CodeArts.

- DevCloud Console FullAccess and BSS Operator

 Custom policies that contain all permissions in DevCloud Console FullAccess as well as the bss:order:view, bss:order:pay, and bss:order:update permissions.

Purchasing a CodeArts Package

CodeArts uses yearly/monthly billing, and provides the free, basic, professional, and enterprise edition packages to meet the requirements of different user scales. For details about these packages, see **Package Overview**.

- Step 1 Go to the Buy CodeArts page.
- **Step 2** Set the region, edition, number of users, required duration, and auto-renewal, agree to the agreement, and click **Next**.

□ NOTE

- You are advised to select the nearest region based on your physical region where your services are located to reduce network latency. The purchased package takes effect only in the corresponding region and cannot be used across regions.
- The Free edition comes with a fixed number of users and duration. To use this edition, click **Try Free**. You do not need to make any payment.
- **Step 3** Confirm the order content. If you need to modify it, click **Previous**. If the content is correct, click **Pay**.
- **Step 4** Follow the prompts to complete the payment.
- **Step 5** Check the package purchase record back on the CodeArts console.

If the purchase fails, rectify the fault by referring to **Billing FAQs**.

Purchasing Resource Extension

CodeArts provides parallel job extension for multiple services. For details, see **Resource Extension**.

- **Step 1** Go to the **Buy CodeArts Resource Extension** page.
- **Step 2** Set the region, product, type, required duration, and auto-renewal, agree to the agreement, and click **Next**.

□ NOTE

- The configuration items for the selected product and type are displayed. Select the configuration items you need.
- Select a region where you have purchased CodeArts Basic or higher edition, or you cannot purchase resource extensions.
- **Step 3** Confirm the order content. If you need to modify it, click **Previous**. If the content is correct, click **Pay**.
- **Step 4** Follow the prompts to complete the payment.
- **Step 5** Check the resource extension purchase record back on the CodeArts console.

If the purchase fails, rectify the fault by referring to **Billing FAQs**.

Purchasing a Value-Added Feature

CodeArts provides value-added features such as CodeCheck enhanced package. For details, see **Value-added Features**.

- **Step 1** Go to the **CodeArts value-added feature purchase** page.
- **Step 2** Set the region, product, quantity, required duration, and auto-renewal, agree to the agreement, and click **Next**.

□ NOTE

- To purchase the CodeCheck enhanced package, select a region where you have purchased CodeArts Pro or Enterprise edition.
- **Step 3** Confirm the order content. If you need to modify it, click **Previous**. If the content is correct, click **Pay**.
- **Step 4** Follow the prompts to complete the payment.
- **Step 5** Check the value-added feature purchase record back on the CodeArts console.

 If the purchase fails, rectify the fault by referring to **Billing FAQs**.

1.3 Modifying Specifications

Prerequisites

To perform this operation, you must have any of the following permissions:

- Tenant Administrator
- DevCloud Console FullAccess and BSS Administrator
- DevCloud Console FullAccess and BSS Finance
- DevCloud Console FullAccess and BSS Operator
- Custom policies that contain all permissions in DevCloud Console FullAccess as well as bss:order:view, bss:order:pay, and bss:order:update.

Modifying CodeArts Package Specifications

You can modify the specifications of your CodeArts package if needed. For details about the impact, see Impact on Billing After Specification Change.

- **Step 1** Log in to the **CodeArts consoleCodeArts console**, click ^ℚ, and select a region.
- **Step 2** Find the CodeArts package and click **Modify** in the **Operation** column.
- **Step 3** Set the edition, number of users, and change type, agree to the agreement, and click **Next**.

□ NOTE

- If your current edition is Free, only the edition can be changed.
- If you set **Change** to **When renewed**, specify the renewal duration.
- **Step 4** Confirm the order content. If you need to modify it, click **Previous**. If the content is correct, click **Pay**.
- **Step 5** Follow the prompts to complete the payment.

Modifying Resource Extension Configuration

The resource extensions of all supported services except CodeArts Build can be changed.

- **Step 1** Log in to the **CodeArts console**, click , and select a region.
- **Step 2** Find the resource extension record, and click **Modify** in the **Operation** column.
- **Step 3** Select a new configuration, set the change type, agree to the agreement, and click **Next**.
- **Step 4** Confirm the order content. If you need to modify it, click **Previous**. If the content is correct, click **Pay**.
- **Step 5** Follow the prompts to complete the payment.

1.4 Creating a Project

Scenario

In CodeArts, projects are the basis for using various services. Operations such as requirement planning, code management, build, and deployment must be performed in a CodeArts project.

CodeArts provides multiple preset project templates for different requirement management processes. This section uses the Scrum process as an example to describe how to create a CodeArts project. For more information about preset templates, see **Using a Project Template**.

Prerequisites

To create CodeArts projects, you must have either of the following permissions:

- Tenant Administrator. For details about how to grant the Tenant Administrator role to a user, see Creating a User Group and Assigning Permissions.
- CodeArts project creator. For details about how to set a user as a project creator, see Setting Project Creators.

Setting Project Creators

To set CodeArts project creators, you must have the **Tenant Administrator** role.

- **Step 1** Go to the CodeArts homepage.
 - 1. Log in to the CodeArts console, click , and select a region.
 - 2. Click Access Service.
- **Step 2** Click the username on the navigation bar and choose **All Account Settings**.
- **Step 3** Choose **General** > **Project Creators**.
- **Step 4** Select **Only some members can create projects**. The member list is displayed.
- **Step 5** Enable or disable the authorization by clicking . Unauthorized members cannot create projects.

Creating a CodeArts Project

- **Step 1** Go to the CodeArts homepage.
 - 1. Log in to the **CodeArts console**, click $^{\bigcirc}$, and select a region.
 - 2. Click Access Service.
- **Step 2** On the CodeArts homepage, click **Create Project** and select **Scrum**.

If there is no project on the homepage, click **Select** on the **Scrum** card.

Step 3 Set the project information and click **OK**.

1.5 Adding Project Members

1.5.1 Introduction

CodeArts allows you to add members to a project in the following ways:

- Adding members: As a project administrator, you can add members from different sources:
 - Adding IAM Users from Your Account
 - Adding Members from Another Project
 - Adding Members from Another Account
 - Adding Members from an Agency
- Inviting users via link: A project member shares the project QR code or link with other users. The users can scan the QR code or visit the link to apply to join the project.

1.5.2 Adding IAM Users from Your Account

Scenario

You can create multiple IAM users in your account, and then add them as project members in CodeArts.

Prerequisites

- A CodeArts project is available, and you have the member settings permission for the project.
- You have created an IAM user. If there is no IAM user, create one by referring to **Creating an IAM User**.

Adding IAM Users as Project Members


Step 1 Go to the CodeArts homepage.

- 1. Log in to the **CodeArts console**, click $^{\circ}$, and select a region.
- 2. Click Access Service.

Step 2 Click the target project name to access the project.

- **Step 3** In the navigation pane, choose **Settings** > **Members**.
- **Step 4** Click the **Member View** tab, click **Add Members**, and select **From My Account**.
- Step 5 Select users and click Next.
- **Step 6** Click the **Role** drop-down list, select a role for each user, and click **Save**.

Step 7 Check the new members in the member list.

Follow-up Operations

If you have the member settings permission, you can go to a project, choose **Settings** > **Members**, and perform the following operations.

1.5.3 Adding Members from Another Project

Scenario

If members of project A need to join project B, add these members by selecting **Users from Other Projects** in project B.

Prerequisites

You have at least two projects that meet the following requirements:


- One of the projects has members.
- You have the member settings permission to the other project (the project for which you want to add members).

Adding Users from Another Project

- **Step 1** Go to the CodeArts homepage.
 - 1. Log in to the **CodeArts console**, click $^{\circ}$, and select a region.
 - 2. Click Access Service.
- **Step 2** Click the target project name to access the project.
- **Step 3** In the navigation pane, choose **Settings** > **Members**.
- **Step 4** Click the **Member View** tab, click **Add Members**, and select **From Another Project**.
- **Step 5** In the displayed dialog box, select a project from the **Project** drop-down list. Members of the selected project are displayed.

Step 6 Select users, select a role from the **Role** drop-down list for each user, and click **Save**.

1.5.4 Adding Members from Another Account

Scenario

When enterprises A and B collaborate on a project, enterprise A can add IAM users in the account of enterprise B as members.

- There are two accounts: A and B. IAM user a of account A has created CodeArts project X and wants to invite IAM user b of account B to become a member of project X.
- The operations in this section will be performed on the CodeArts console and homepage.
 - CodeArts console: Account A authorizes account B. Account B then accepts the authorization.
 - CodeArts homepage: Account A goes to project X and adds an IAM user of account B.

Prerequisites

- Project **X** has been created in account A. User **a** has the member setting permission in this project.
- The authorized account **(B)** and authorizing account **(A)** must be from the same site.
- The account (B) of the invited user (b) has accepted the authorization from account A. For details, see Authorizing an Enterprise Account on the CodeArts Console and Accepting Authorization from Another Enterprise Account on the CodeArts Console.
- To authorize an account by using an agency ID, the account (B) to invite must have an agency whose delegated object is IAM Identity Center. If there is no such agency, perform the following steps to create one:

- a. Create a user
- b. Create a permission set
- c. Associate an account with users/groups and permission sets

Authorizing an Enterprise Account on the CodeArts Console

The following operations are performed by account A.

To authorize other enterprise accounts, you must have the **Tenant Administrator** role or the **DevCloud Console FullAccess** policy.

- **Step 1** Log in to the **CodeArts console**, click $^{\bigcirc}$, and select a region.
- **Step 2** In the navigation pane, choose **Enterprise Account Authorization**.
- **Step 3** Click the **Granted Authorizations** tab, and then click **Authorize Enterprise Account**.
- **Step 4** Enter the ID of the target enterprise account, and click **Authorize**.

The enterprise account ID can be obtained on the **My Credentials** page.

- Log in to the management console, hover over the username in the upper right corner, and choose My Credentials from the drop-down list.
- 2. On the API Credentials page, obtain the value of Account ID.
- **Step 5** Check the authorization record.
 - If the target account needs to manually accept the authorization, the record status becomes **Pending**.
 - When the authorization is accepted (either manually or automatically), the record status changes to **Enabled**. To delete the record, click **Cancel Authorization**.
 - If the invitation is rejected, the record status changes to **Rejected**. You can click **Re-authorize** to try again.



Accepting Authorization from Another Enterprise Account on the CodeArts Console

The following operations are performed by account B.

The invited account can automatically or manually accept the authorization on the CodeArts console.

To change the authorization mode and manually accept authorizations, you must have the **Tenant Administrator** role or the **DevCloud Console FullAccess** policy.

To manually accept an authorization, perform the following steps:

- **Step 1** Log in to the **CodeArts console**, click , and select a region.
- **Step 2** In the navigation pane, choose **Enterprise Account Authorization**.
- **Step 3** Click the **Received Authorizations** tab. The received authorization is in the **Pending** state.
- **Step 4** Accept or reject the authorization.
 - Accept: In the displayed dialog box, click OK. The status changes to Enabled.
 To delete the authorization, click Exit.
 - **Reject**: In the displayed dialog box, click **OK**. The status changes to **Rejected**.



Adding Users from Another Enterprise in a CodeArts Project

The following operations are performed by account A.

- **Step 1** Go to the CodeArts homepage.
 - 1. Log in to the CodeArts console, click $^{\circ}$, and select a region.
 - 2. Click Access Service.
- **Step 2** Click the target project name to access the project.
- **Step 3** In the navigation pane, choose **Settings** > **Members**.
- **Step 4** Click the **Member View** tab, and choose **Add Members** > **From Another Account**.
- **Step 5** In the displayed dialog box, select the account of the users to invite, specify the invitation mode, enter the ID, and click **Invite**.
 - User ID: ID of a user to invite, which can be obtained from the My Credentials page. For details, see API Credentials.
 - **Agency ID**: ID of an agency created in the invited account. The ID can be obtained from the **Agencies** page in IAM.

1.5.5 Adding Members from an Agency

Huawei Cloud IAM Identity Center service works with the Organizations service to provide unified identity management and access control across accounts.


In CodeArts, you can add users created and authorized in IAM Identity Center as project members.


Prerequisites

- A CodeArts project is available, and you have the member settings permission for the project.



1.6 Managing Permissions

1.6.1 Managing Project Permissions

CodeArts provides role-based access control (RBAC). New users do not have any permissions assigned by default. You need to first add them to one or more projects and then assign roles to these users. The users can perform specified operations on cloud services based on the permissions they have been assigned.

CodeArts has multiple built-in system roles. You can also create custom roles with desired permissions for CodeArts Req, CodeArts Repo, CodeArts Check, CodeArts Build, CodeArts Artifact, CodeArts Deploy, CodeArts TestPlan, and CodeArts Pipeline.

Modifying Permissions of a System Role

Ensure that you have permission to assign permissions in the project.

- The permissions of the project administrator role cannot be edited.
- The general permissions of the project manager role cannot be edited.

Agent pools are used to connect custom executors. You can add your own execution resources to an agent pool so that you can use them to execute tasks. Agent pools help improve efficiency and remove dependency on public execution resources.

1.7.2 Creating an Agent

Scenario

An agent is installed on a host and registered with CodeArts. It is used for code check and build tasks as a custom executor.

Restrictions

- Install only one agent on a host. If multiple agents are installed, some of them may go offline during task execution.
- Each agent executes only one task at a time.
- To ensure successful installation, do not use temporary AK/SK.

Prerequisites

You have the owner or administrator permission for the target agent pool.

◯ NOTE

If you create an agent as an IAM Identity Center user (a user created in the IAM Identity Center), use the AK/SK of an IAM user who has at least the administrator permission.

- An agent pool has been created. For details, see **Creating an Agent Pool**.
- A host that meets the following requirements is available:
 - Specifications: 4 vCPUs | 8 GiB or above, disk space > 80 GiB
 - Java 8 and Git are installed. If the agent pool type is LINUX_DOCKER,
 Docker must also be installed.

■ NOTE

- If you use a Linux host, you can choose auto agent installation, or manually install the agent using the **root** account.
- If you use a Windows or macOS host, manually install the agent on it using the system administrator account.
- If you use a Windows host, install 64-bit Java 8.

1.8 Creating Service Endpoints

Scenario

A service endpoint is an extension of CodeArts. It enables CodeArts to connect to third-party services.

For example, when your CodeArts tasks need to obtain project source code from a third-party GitHub repository or need to run with Jenkins, you can create an endpoint to connect to each service.

The following table lists the endpoints supported by CodeArts.



1.10.3 Managing CodeArts Projects and Members

The administrator can view all the projects and members under their account on the **Projects and Members** page and perform necessary operations there.


To remove members from the **Project Members** tab, ensure that you have been assigned the **Tenant Administrator** role.
