## Written declaration on establishing a European Sports Day

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the White Paper on Sports,
- having regard to Rule 116 of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. whereas sport makes an important contribution to the European Union's strategic objectives of solidarity and prosperity,
- B. whereas sport promotes the active contribution of EU citizens to society and contributes to personal development, without discriminating on any grounds,
- C. whereas a lack of physical exercise can lead to an increase in obesity and chronic illnesses, especially among children,
- D. whereas the Olympic ideal of developing sport to promote peace and understanding among nations and cultures was born in Europe,
- E. whereas the European Year of Education through Sport 2004, aimed at improving the partnership between the worlds of education and sport, was successful,
- 1. Underlines the role of sport in the social, cultural, health and educational fields, and considers that it is an excellent instrument of social cohesion in Europe;
- 2. Highlights the fact that sport can also contribute to dealing with new threats and challenges emerged in European society;
- 3. Proposes that the Commission establish an annual European Sports Day on 14 May, to commemorate the first time that women participated in the Olympic Games (1900 Paris Summer Olympics) as a signal of the equality that sport should promote in all areas;
- 4. Instructs its President to forward this declaration, together with the names of the signatories, to the parliaments and governments of the Member States.
