### B. Derivative Counterparty Credit Risk: Why the New Risk Measure C Have Such a Significant Impact

SA-CCR is the new Standardised Approach for Counterparty Credit Risk t banks will have to implement in the near future. ISDA's detailed proprietar study, discussed in this panel, suggests SA-CCR can produce very differe results from the Current Exposure Method (CEM) it replaces. But its use is much broader than just risk capital, it also impacts the Leverage Ratio (LF Large Exposures (LE) and CCP exposure calculations. To understand wh CCR matters to you, join this session which will cover:

- Why is SA-CCR relevant to banks' regulatory frameworks? Key to measure to LR, CVA, LE, Exposures to CCPs, potentially to Net Sta Funding Ratio (NSFR) and as a capital floor.
- Is SA-CCR a credible alternative to internal models, can it be used floor and could it become more risk-sensitive without becoming too complex?
- What is SA-CCR's impact on bank capital, is it reasonable and align with the Group of Central Bank Governors and Heads of Supervisio (GHOS) mandate not to further increase capital levels?
- Global consistency and implementation: Will SA-CCR be applied consistently across all jurisdictions? What are key implementation challenges?
