VISITOR GUIDE

NASA's Glenn Research Center in Cleveland designs and develops innovative technologies to revolutionize air travel, advance space exploration, and improve life on Earth.

Glenn's unique, world-class facilities enable NASA, other government agencies, and academic and industry partners to perform specialized aerospace research and testing. As a leading expert in power, propulsion, and communications, Glenn makes major contributions to NASA's aeronautics and spaceflight missions.

NASA's Neil Armstrong Test Facility in Sandusky offers the world's largest and most powerful space environment simulation chambers. Stationed on 6,400 acres, it is also the only place in the world that tests full-sized spacecraft in the simulated extreme conditions of spaceflight. The facility has tested everything from the Orion spacecraft and Mars rovers to flight hardware for commercial space companies.

With a highly skilled workforce of more than 3,000 scientists, engineers, technicians, and support personnel, Glenn is integral to the region's economy. The center's economic impact in Ohio is nearly \$2 billion per year and supports 8,300 jobs across the state.

Duration of Visitor Badges

All official visitors will receive an official visitor pass to access NASA Glenn Research Center for a period not to exceed 29 days in a calendar year.

Citizenship and Identification

An official visitor must be a U.S. citizen or one of the following: lawful permanent resident (LPR), also known as permanent resident alien (PRA) or green card holder; U.S. citizen representing a foreign entity; or a person with multiple citizenships (one of which is U.S.).

All visitors age 18 and over (including bus drivers for scheduled groups) are required to present one form of current government-issued photo identification. Identification must be one of the following:

- Driver's license or ID card issued by a state. Driver's licenses that do not have photos cannot be used for photo identification.
- U.S. passport or U.S. passport card
- ID card issued by a U.S. federal, state, or local government agency or entity provided it contains a photo and name (e.g., U.S. military ID card or PIV badge)
- U.S. Permanent Resident card (green card) or Alien Registration Receipt card (I-551)
- Employment Authorization Document (I-766), provided it contains a photo
- Foreign passport, provided it contains a photo and name

Please note: if a current and valid form of government-issued photo identification cannot be presented, access to the center will be denied.

Visitors are required to display their visitor pass on their outermost garment and above the waist during the visit and must be always accompanied by a NASA Glenn badged employee.

Foreign nationals who are LPRs, also known as PRAs or green card holders; U.S. citizens representing a foreign entity; and persons with multiple citizenships (one of which is U.S.) will be processed as a U.S. citizen.

If a visitor is not a U.S. citizen, the visitor must be processed in accordance with the NASA Foreign National Access Management Program.

Inspection Notice

NASA policy for entry into, continued presence on, or exiting from this real property, facility, or installation is contingent upon the visitor's consent to inspection of their person and property in their possession or under their control. Therefore, all vehicles and bags are subject to inspection and visitors may experience a slight delay upon entering the center. Please factor this potential delay into your schedule. A refusal to inspection will result in access to the center being denied.

Taxis, shuttles, and rideshare vehicles are not permitted on center. All visitors using these services will be required to be dropped off at the Main Gate parking lot.

Photography

Photography is permitted, except for: NASA-designated Limited and Exclusion areas (identified as such by signs conspicuously posted on the exterior of applicable facilities), utility infrastructure (e.g., electrical, sewage lift stations, substations, etc.), Sensitive But Unclassified, export controlled, ITAR-restricted, or classified technology, material, hardware, or test equipment, and fuel storage areas. Visitors shall refer to their host or escort for further information.

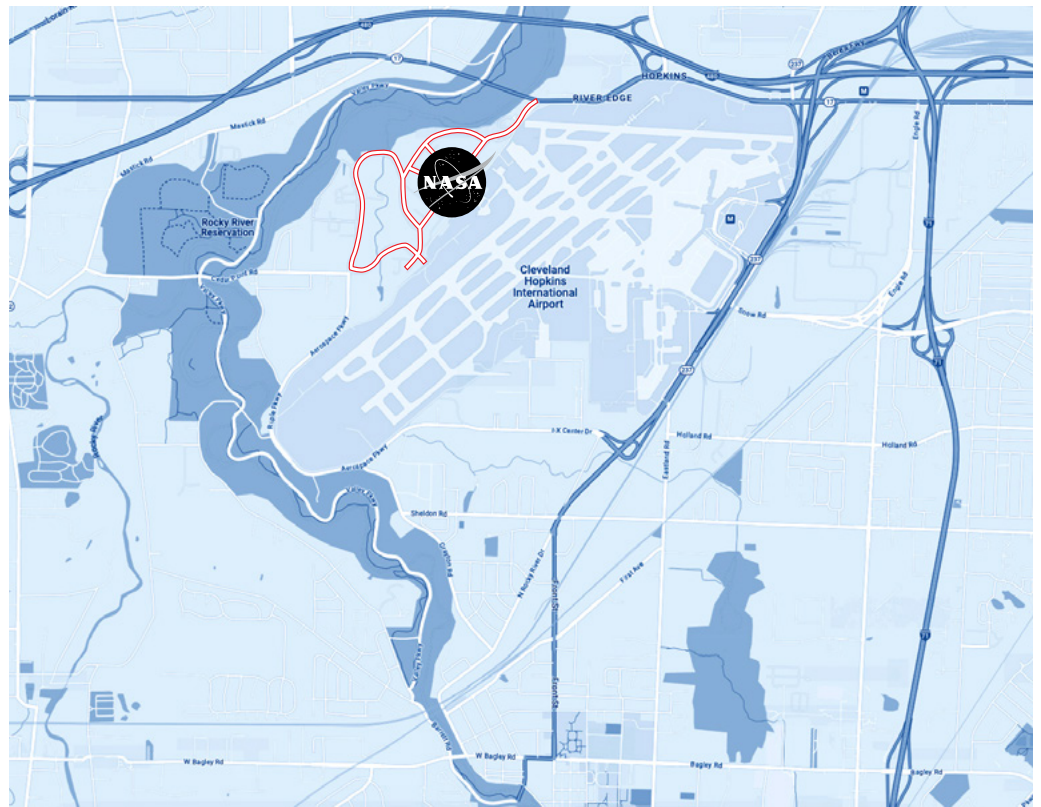

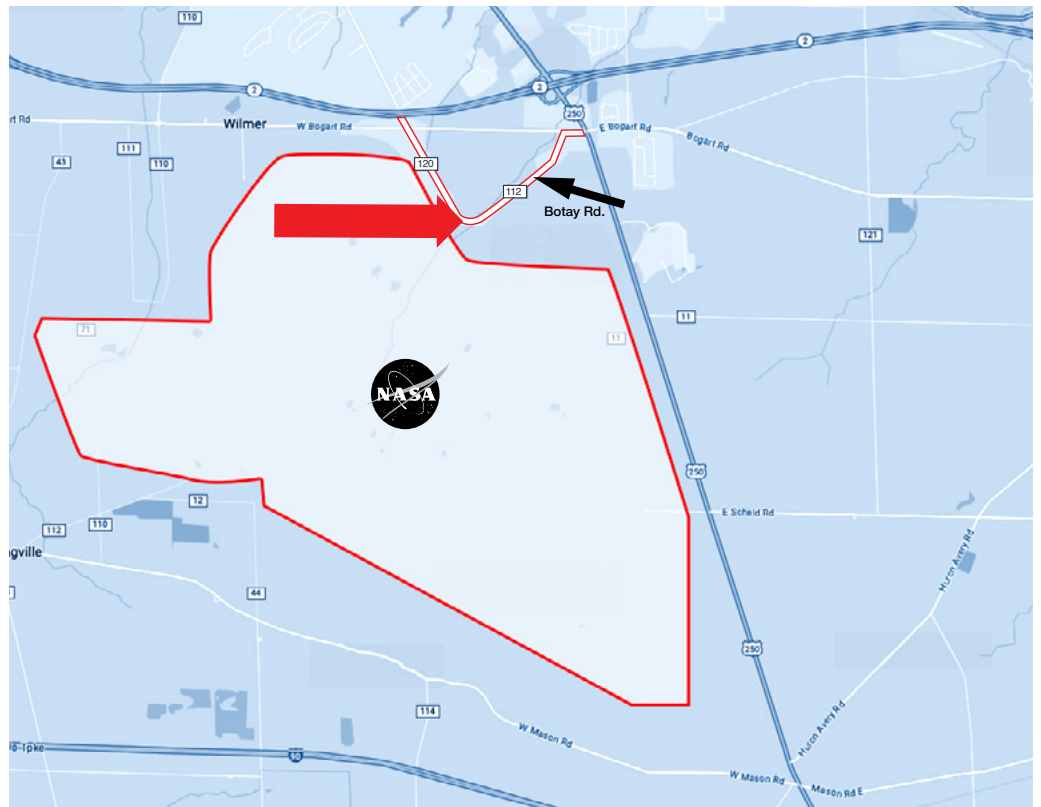

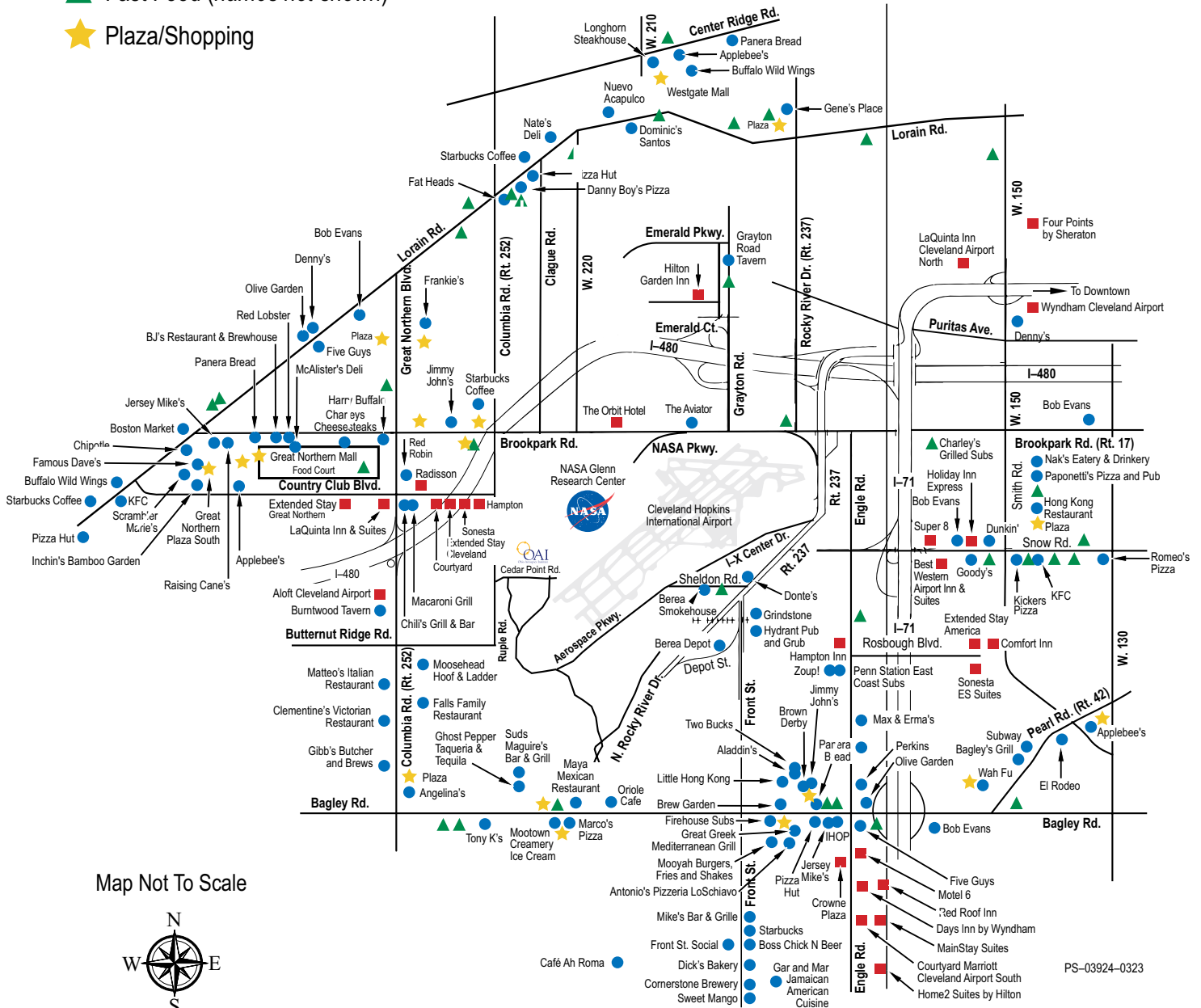

Local Hotel, Food, and Shopping Guide



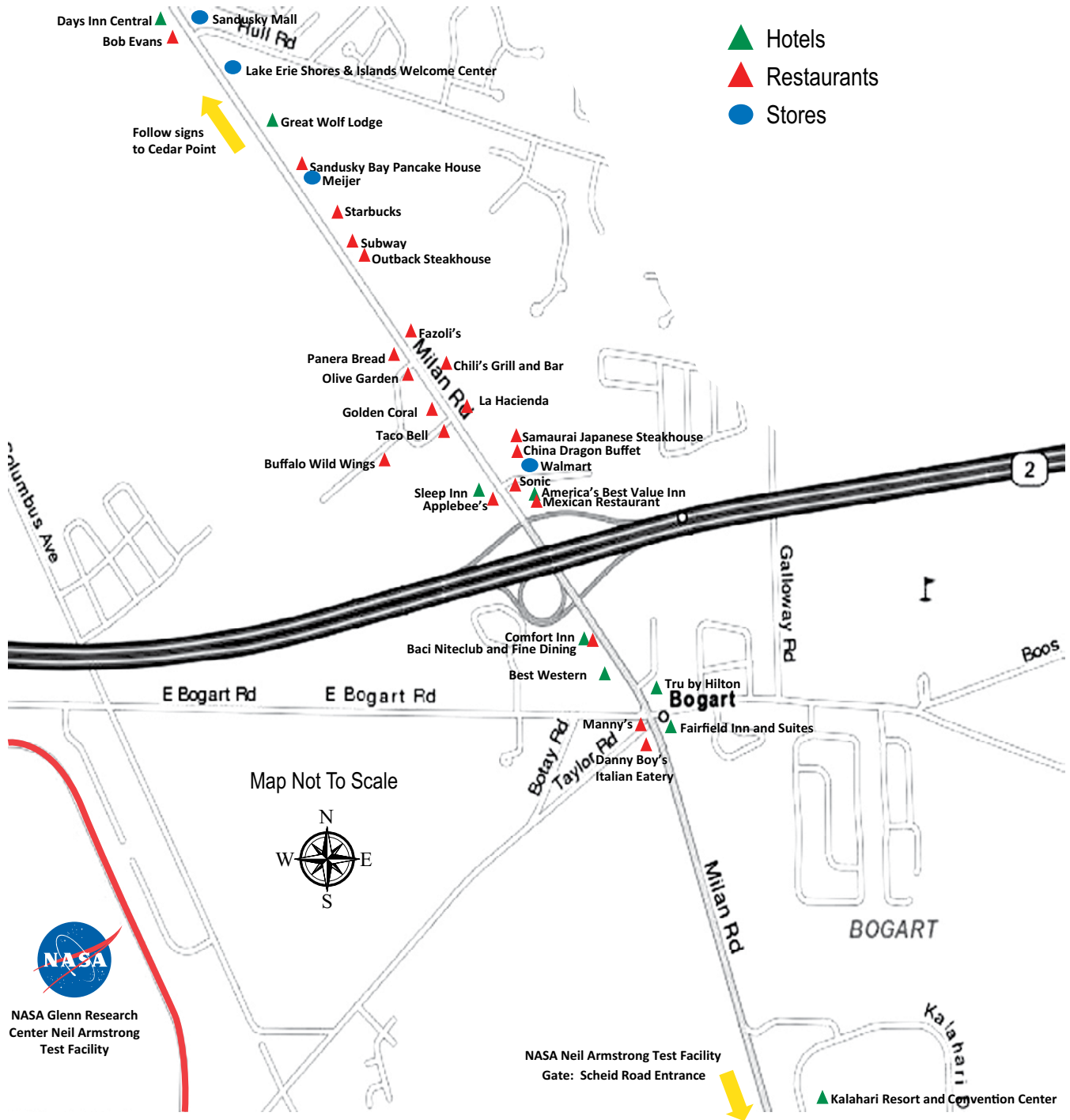
